In 1997, a small Milanese publisher brought the legendary notebook back to life. Following in Chatwin's footsteps Moleskine notebooks have resumed their travels, proving themselves as indispensable companions to the innovative technologies and connected world of today. Capturing reality in movement, inscribing the unique nature of experience on paper: Moleskine notebooks are batteries that store our innermost ideas and feelings, releasing their energy over time.

Today, the legacy of the little black rectangle has opened up new possibilities for creativity on the move. Timeless bags, accessories, writing tools, smart notebooks, digital tools and device accessories join the original notebook. Combined they represent contemporary nomadism around the world.
